The petitioner has preferred this writ petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India praying for issuance of writ in the nature of mandamus for directing respondents to count the military service rendered by the petitioner during the Second National Emergency w.e.f. 03.12.1971 to 25.03.1977 towards pensionary benefits in view of the judgment passed by this Court in CWP No. 17661 of 2013 titled as Rajinder Singh Vs. State of Punjab and Others and release of all the consequential benefits alongwith interest.

Learned counsel for the petitioner presses the present petition only for counting of the said military service in question for the purpose towards pensionary benefits.

Para 4 of the reply of the respondent Nos. 1 and 2 shows that the petitioner was entitled to counting of said military service towards pension only and not for grant of increments.

In view of the admitted position, present petition is allowed to the extent that the respondents are ordered to count the period of military service rendered during the Second National Emergency i.e. 03.12.1971 to 25.03.1977 toward grant of pension. The respondents are accordingly, directed to re-fix the pension of the petitioner and release the same within two months from date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
