The grievance of the petitioner is that his services were terminated without following due process and on account of the fact that an FIR was registered against him.

It is contended that the petitioner has been exonerated by the JMIC, Rajpura in the said proceedings by judgment dated 16.05.2016 (Annexure P-3). The petitioner has already approached the Department concerned by way of representation dated 16.02.2017 (Annexure P-5) for redressal of his grievances and to be taken back in service, however, the same is still pending consideration. At the present moment, limited prayer is made that the respondents should be directed to decide the said representation as expeditiously as possible.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and in view of the limited prayer made, without going into the merits of the case, respondent No. 2 is hereby directed to decide the representation dated 16.02.2017 (Annexure P-5) by passing a speaking order within a period of

three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. In case, the petitioner is found entitled to the relief as sought by way of this writ petition, the same be granted to him within a period of one month thereafter.

Writ petition stands disposed of.
