The petitioners herein had preferred the instant writ petition seeking to quash the impugned order dated 14.05.2013 (*Annexure P-17*) which was conveyed to them by office memo dated 10.07.2013 (*Annexure P-18*) whereby their claim for regularization had been declined.

It was contended in the writ petition that the petitioners, who had been working continuously for the past several years, were entitled to regularization by relying upon several policies/Government instructions that had been issued from time to time.

During the pendency of this writ petition, learned counsel for respondent No. 3 had made a statement that the case of the petitioners was under consideration.

Today, learned counsel for respondent No. 3 informs this Court that regularization orders dated 27.03.2017 have been issued wherein

services of petitioners No. 2 to 8 have been regularized with immediate effect. It is stated that petitioners No. 1 and 9 have already resigned from service which fact is not disputed by learned counsel for the petitioners. A copy of the regularization order dated 27.03.2017 is placed on record.

In view of the fact the relief of regularization has been granted, no further orders are called for in the present writ petition.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners are entitled to regularization w.e.f. 01.04.2011 in terms of the policy dated 18.03.2011 which in fact has not been given to them. He seeks liberty to approach the Government for redressal of the claim in terms of the aforesaid policy.

In view of above, the instant writ petition is disposed of giving liberty to the petitioners to approach the Department by way of representation and in case such representation is filed before the respondent-authority, the same be decided within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
