Petitioner is candidate for recruitment to the post of Math Master pursuant to the advertisement issued on 20.11.2015. He was selected and offer of appointment was issued on 02.11.2016. Petitioner has not reported for duty within the time limit stipulated in the order of appointment i.e. within 15 days from the date of issuance of the offer of appointment. Later on, petitioner came to know that large number of posts have not been filled up. Therefore, he sought for permission to report for duty while requesting for condoning the delay in reporting for duty. Perusal of the writ papers it is evident that petitioner has not questioned the condition imposed relating to reporting for duty within a period of 15 days in the offer of appointment dated 02.11.2016. Before completion of 15 days time, he should have moved necessary representation highlighting inconvenience in reporting for duty within the time limit stipulated. Thus, the petitioner has not made out a case so as to grant relief sought in the present petition.

Hence CWP stands dismissed.
