AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

By this petition the petitioner is seeking direction to the respondent No.2 to disclose the number obtained by her in the written examination for the post of Multi Purpose Health Worker (F) held on 22.01.2017.

The petitioner had applied for the post of MPHWP (F) and had taken the written test. In the OMR Sheet of the written test the condition No.8 (in bold letters) had stated as follows:-

“Candidates are warned not to fold or make any stray marks on the OMR Answer Sheet. Use of Eraser, Nail, Blade, White Fluid/Whitener etc., to smudge, scratch or damage in any manner on the OMR Sheet during Examination is strictly prohibited. If doing so, their Answer Sheet shall be cancelled, and shall not be evaluated.”

It is admitted that in question No.75 the petitioner had marked two options and used eraser for one. Learned counsel states that the petitioner's result has not been declared and the petitioner has moved a representation to the respondents and the respondents should be directed to consider the same.

In my opinion, in view of condition No.8 mentioned in the OMR Sheet and the admitted position, no fault can be found with the action of the respondents if the paper of the petitioner is not checked because the OMR Sheets will be checked by the Computer and if there is any smudging/tampering by Eraser, Nail, Blade, White Fluid etc. the Computer will reject that OMR Sheet. Consequently, any representation in this regard is also meaningless.

Resultantly, the petition is dismissed.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending Civil Misc. Application, if any, also stands disposed of.
