This petition has been filed for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari to quash order dated 19.03.2013 appointing respondent No.4 as Lamberdar of Patti Jhuti, Tehsil and District Bathinda.

Counsel for the petitioner has prayed that the merit of the candidates be reappreciated.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and after examining the record, am of the considered opinion that it is for the Collector to see merits and demerits of the candidates. The appointment of the Lamberdar is the job of the Collector and the Superior Courts have to see as to whether there is anything perverse in the order i.e. whether the Collector has not read or misread the evidence on the record. In the absence of any such thing, choice of the Collector is not to be interfered. No such thing has been brought to my notice. Therefore, I do not find any merit in this petition.
