SURYA KANT, J.(Oral)

Learned counsel for the petitioner as well as for respondent No.6, who is the only contesting respondent, jointly state that the parties have amicably settled their dispute by way of exchanging their respective lands. As far as first such exchange of land is concerned, it has been duly mutated in the jamabandi for 2014-15 whereas the second exchange of land has been made through Memorandum of Agreement dated 24.11.2016 duly signed by both the parties (Annexure P.13). It is stated at the bar that both the parties have acted upon these exchanges and resultantly, the present controversy stands settled. The writ petition is accordingly disposed of as infructuous with a clarificatory direction that both the parties shall abide by the terms and conditions of settlement as well as the exchanges of land entered into by them.
