Petitioner has posed a challenge to the order dated 17.04.2014 (Annexure P-11), whereby the authority has refused to exempt the petitioner Institution from payment of stamp duty and registration fee. Petitioner claims that it is a charitable Institution, thus, entitled for exemption.

At the outset, learned State counsel submits that alternative remedy of revision is available to the petitioner in view of Section 56 of the Act. He further submits that in case petitioner avails alternative remedy, State would not raise any question of delay/laches.

Faced with this situation, counsel for the petitioner submits that he be allowed to withdraw the present petition with liberty to approach the competent authority under the said provision.

In view of the statement made by learned counsel for the petitioner, this petition is dismissed as withdrawn with liberty as aforesaid.
