By virtue of the instant petition preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought issuance of writ/order or direction in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to reimburse/release the full payment of medical claim amounting to Rs.4,54,052/- along with interest @ 18% per annum on account of delayed payment.

The contention of learned counsel for the petitioner is that though the medical bill for its reimbursement was submitted to respondent No.2 along with forwarding letter dated 17th May, 2016 but despite that, period of more than one year has lapsed but no action has been taken for the disbursement thereof.

After hearing learned counsel for the petitioner and perusal of the case file, the instant petition is treated as representation on behalf of the petitioner and is disposed of with direction to respondent No.2-The Director of Public Instructions (Schools), Punjab to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in the petition/representation and to take a conscious decision that too, by passing a speaking order within a

period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

In case petitioner still feels aggrieved of any order passed by respondent No.2 or any other authority in this regard, the petitioner shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
