By virtue of instant petition preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to release the retiral benefits of Suresh Kumar husband of the petitioner alongwith interest @ 12% per annum.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the husband of the petitioner has expired during service on April 04, 2017. He further submits that though a legal notice dated May 29, 2017 (Anneuxre P-6) was served upon respondents but till date retiral benefits has not been released in favour of the petitioner.

Instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.3 to

look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in the legal notice dated May 29, 2017 (Annexure P-6) and to decide the same within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. Respondent No.3 is further directed to consider the grant of interest on delayed payment in view of full Bench judgment passed by this Court in the case of **A.S. Randhawa vs. State of Punjab; 1997 (3) SCT 468;** as well judgment passed by this Court in case **Charan Dass vs. State of Punjab & others; CWP No. 8772 of 2015,** decided on July 11, 2015.

However, if the petitioner still feels aggrieved he shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
