1.) In the instant writ petition, the petitioner has questioned the validity of the order dated 22.2.2012 (Annexure P-6) by which the concerned respondent has rejected the claim of the petitioner for appointment to the post of Anganwari Worker on the score that petitioner has obtained matriculation certificate from the Board of Higher Education, Delhi on 19.6.2001. The aforesaid Board is not recognized by the Competent Authority, namely, Ministry of Human Resource Development.

2.) Short question for consideration is that obtaining matriculation certificate from Board of Higher Secondary Education Delhi is valid or not.

The petitioner has failed to produce any material to show that the Board of High Secondary Education, Delhi is recognized Board by the Competent Authority. On the other hand, learned counsel for the petitioner orally submitted that it was recognized and it was withdrawn on 12.7.2007. However, no material has been produced by the petitioner.

3.) On the contrary, learned counsel for the respondents vehemently contended that matter is squarely covered by the decision of this Court rendered in **Desh Raj Vs. State of Haryana and others** decided on 22.04.2016. This Court relied on the affidavit filed by the Union of India who is the Competent Authority to give recognition to Education Board like Board of Higher Secondary Education, Delhi. Admittedly, the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India have not recognized the Board of Higher Secondary Education, Delhi. Therefore, question of withdrawal of recognition on 12.7.2011 do not arise.

4.) Admittedly, the petitioner is unable to produce any material to show that the Board of High Secondary Education, Delhi is recognized and subsequently recognition has been withdrawn. In the absence of necessary material to show that matriculation certificate issued by the Board of High Secondary Education, Delhi is recognized, the petitioner has not made out a case so as to contend that the matriculation certificate issued by the Board of Higher Secondary Education, Delhi is equivalent to any other certificate issued by the recognized Board. Unless and until Board of Higher Secondary Education, Delhi is recognized, the question of equating the matriculation certificate issued by the Board of Higher Secondary Education, Delhi cannot be compared with the recognized Board. Thus, the
