The instant writ petition was filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to allow the petitioner to participate in the interview for the post of Head Master as he could not participate in the interview held on 07.09.2014 and 12.09.2014 on account of the fact that he had been sent to attend a seminar by the Department itself.

After issuance of notice of motion, a short affidavit dated 04.09.2015 of Mr. Karamjit Singh, Assistant Director, Education Recruitment Board has been filed, in which it is submitted that the petitioner was interviewed by the Education Recruitment Board on 16.03.2015. The affidavit further discloses that the petitioner had obtained only 8 marks in the interview securing a total of 52.6726 marks and did not fall into the zone of selected candidates for consideration to the post of Head Master.

In view of the fact that the primary relief sought, that was to be interviewed on account of the fact that the petitioner was unable to appear

before the Recruitment Board, has been granted, no further orders are called for in this writ petition.

The petitioner herein is aggrieved against the number of marks that have been awarded to him. For that, he would be at liberty to approach the Department for consideration of his grievance or he is at liberty to avail of any legal remedy available to him in accordance with law.

Writ petition stands disposed of.
