This petition is filed to challenge the order dated 30.05.2017 by which objection filed by the petitioner against the preparation of Naksha Be has been dismissed.

In short, the mode of partition was accepted as it is. Thereafter, Naksha Be was prepared by the authorities. The petitioner was not satisfied with Naksha Be because it was not in accordance with the mode of partition. He filed objection. The said objection was dismissed. The appeal filed by the petitioner was allowed and the Collector remanded the case back to the AC 2nd Grade for preparation of Naksha Be in terms of the mode of partition but still the AC 2nd Grade prepared the same Naksha Be as it was earlier prepared. Therefore, the petitioner again filed objection against the preparation of Naksha Be which was dismissed on 30.05.2017. Since the petitioner still have the remedy of appeal under Section 13 of the Punjab Land Revenue Act, 1887 against the order of the AC 2nd Grade, therefore, the present writ petition, in the presence of a statutory alternate remedy, is not maintainable.

At this stage, counsel for the petitioner prays for withdrawal of the petition in order to avail his remedy of appeal at the first instance.

Dismissed as withdrawn with the liberty aforesaid.
