By virtue of instant petition preferred under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to refix the pension of the petitioner as per Government Circular dated October 05, 2011 (Annexure P-3) and in view of judgments passed by this Court (Annexures P-8 to P-10).

2. At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that though a representation dated April 17, 2017 (Annexure P-11) was moved by the petitioner to the respondents but till date no action has been taken. He further submits that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.2 to decide the same within a stipulated period.

3. Accordingly, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in his legal notice dated April 17, 2017 (Annexure P-11) and take a conscious decision in accordance with law, Rules and Instructions issued by a Government from time to time and particularly in view of judgment dated August 02, 2017 passed in CWP No. 2805 of 2017 titled as **Kamlesh Kumar and others vs. State of Punjab and another;** wherein, relief granted as per judgments rendered in case **State of Punjab and others vs. A.P. Sharma and others; 2017 (1) SCT 322** as well as in the case of **Karamvir Singh & others vs. State of Punjab & others; 2016 (4) SCT 715**, within a period of two months from the date of certified copy of this order. However, if the petitioner still feels aggrieved by any order of the afore-said authority, he shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
