By virtue of instant petition preferred under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought issuance of writ in the nature of mandamus, directing the respondents to release ₹3,07,900.60 of medical reimbursement to the petitioner, which have been incurred by the petitioner on his treatment, his wife and son with 18% interest. And further to make the payment of travelling allowance, daily allowance and dearness allowance as per Central Services (Medical attendance) Rules, 1944.

2. At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner feels satisfied in case direction is issued to respondents to decide the advance legal notice dated 27.04.2017 (Annexure P-6) within a stipulated period.

3. Instant petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondent(s)

to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in his legal notice dated 27.04.2017 (Annexure P-6) and to decide the same within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. However, if the petitioner still feels aggrieved against the order passed by the concerned authority, he shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
