CWP No.19096 of 2017

Through the instant civil writ petition, preferred under Article
226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of a
writ in the nature of certiorari quashing the charge sheet dated July 13, 2007
(P-3) and inquiry report dated February 25, 2009 (P-4) and further for
issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to

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release the retiral dues of the petitioner viz. Pension, leave encashment, gratuity, GPF along with interest @ 18%.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that though a representation was made to the respondent No.2 on February 08, 2017 (P-7) but till date no conscious decision has been taken by the concerned Authority.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that she feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.2 to decide her representation dated February 08, 2017 (P-7) within some specified period.

4. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents No.2-The Director, Health and Family Welfare, Punjab, Parivar Kalyan Bhawan, Sector 34-A, Chandigarh to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in her representation dated February 08, 2017 (P-7) and to take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order within a period of four months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

5. However, if petitioner still feels aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, she shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
