Counsel would submit that the petitioners, who were working as Math Mistresses, were denied benefit of promotion to the post of Lecturer while granting such benefit to the juniors. Subsequently upon the matter having been agitated, vide orders dated 13.5.2010 (Annexure P-1) and 11.8.2010 (Annexure P-2) petitioners were promoted to the post of Lecturer w.e.f. the date their juniors had been so promoted.

Grievance raised in the instant petition is that the consequential benefits in the nature of pay fixation, seniority etc. in pursuance to the promotion order at Annexures P-1 and P-2 have not been granted.

Counsel makes a categorical statement that the petitioners are not pressing for actual arrears of salary for the period that the petitioners had not worked on the post of Lecturer.

In the light of the facts and circumstances noticed herein above and against the backdrop of the submissions advanced by counsel, I deem it appropriate to dispose of the present petition with a direction to respondent no.1 to consider the claim/grievance of the petitioners in terms of taking a final decision on the legal notice dated 3.7.2017 (Annexure P-3)

expeditiously and in any case within a period of four months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.
