By virtue of instant petition preferred under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to release the retiral benefits i.e. commutation of pension, gratuity, leave encashment and all other consequential benefits along with interest @ 18% per annum on delayed payments from the date these have become due till payment and to grant the benefit of ACP for the year 2008 and 2016 with interest.

2. At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that though a representation dated August 01, 2017 (Annexure P-2) was moved by the petitioner to the respondents but till date no action has been taken. He further submits that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.2 to decide the representation dated August 01, 2017 (Annexure P-2) within a stipulated period.

3. Accordingly, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in his representation dated August 01, 2017 (Annexure P-2) and take a conscious decision in accordance with law, particularly in view of judgment passed by this Court in CWP No. 18427 of 2017 titled as **Partap Singh Birthal vs. State of Haryana & others;** decided on August 21, 2017, within a period of three months from the date of certified copy of this order. However, if the petitioner still feels aggrieved by any order of the afore-said authority, he shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
