The petitioner's bid for taking shop Nos.22 & 23 at Bus Stand, Sector-43, Chandigarh on monthly lease was not opened as it was a single bid. The aggrieved petitioner made a representation and thereafter approached this Court. Directions were issued to decide his representation. Meanwhile, the Competent Authority floated a fresh publication dated 08.08.2017. The petitioner again gave his bid alongwith other bidders. The subject shops have now been leased out to respondent No.3 vide memo dated 14.09.2017 (P-7). Admittedly, the shops have been leased out at a monthly rent which is higher than what the petitioner had offered. For that reason alone, no interference by this Court in this matter is called for. The petitioner's contention that non-acceptance of his offer on the ground of it being single bid, is not a valid ground. Even if there is any merit in the contention, the fact remains that through a subsequent bid, the shops have been leased out at a higher rate benefiting the State exchequer. The petitioner's apprehension is that higher bid had been given by his rival only

to interfere with the impugned action.

Dismissed.
