By virtue of instant petition preferred under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to release pensionary benefits to petitioner in terms of the PEPSU Road Transport Corporation Employees Pension/Gratuity and General Provident Fund Regulations 1992 dated 15.06.1992 (Annexure P-4) and PRTC (Conditions of appointment and Service Regulation) 1981, as amended upto 11.08.2010 (P-5), alongwith all consequential benefits with interest @ 18% per annum.

At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that though the petitioner has moved various representations to the respondent but till date no action has been taken. He further submits that petitioner feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent to decide the representations

moved by the petitioner dated 09.05.2014, 13.11.2014, 06.03.2015, 22.10.2015 and 23.06.2016 (Annexures P-6 to P-10) within a stipulated period.

Accordingly, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in his representations (Annexures P-6 to P-10) and to decide the same particularly, in view of PRTC Regulations (Annexure P-4) as well as PRTC (Conditions of Appointments and Service Regulations) (Annexure P-5) within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

However, if the petitioner still feels aggrieved by any order of the afore-said authority, he shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
