In the instant writ petition, petitioner has sought for the following relief:-

“(i) issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to join the petitioner on the post of Constable (GD) in BSF examination held in 2011, as the petitioner has been declared qualified by respondent no. 2 on 04.02.2015 and most of the selected candidates have been issued appointment letters and have joined their respective departments, but the respondents are delaying and harassing the petitioner on one pretext or the other.”

Pursuant to the order dated 13.07.2017, Deputy Regional

Director of Staff Selection Commission considered the petitioner's grievance and proceeded to declare him selected to the post of Constable (GD) in the post Code 'D' i.e. SSB under domicile of Himachal Pradesh. Further petitioner's name has been forwarded to the SSP for issuing offer of appointment. As on this day, SSP have not issued offer of appointment to the petitioner. It is to be noted that with reference to selection process of the year 2011 while implementing decision passed in Writ Petition (C) 8004 of 2014 (*Navratan Singh and others Vs. UOI & another*) by the Hon'ble Delhi High Court respondents have revised the list and it was notified while set-righting various discrepancies committed by the officials as well as candidates and it was announced on 4.2.2015. Petitioner is also entitled to appointment from the date on which revised result dated 4.2.2015 has been implemented. To that extent the petitioner is entitled for notional appointment to the post of Constable (GD). The same shall be taken note of by the SSP while issuing offer of appointment to the petitioner and issue notional appointment order. SSP-appointing authority is hereby directed to issue offer of appointment within a period of 8 weeks from today.

With the above observations, petition stands disposed of.
