By virtue of instant petition preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioners have sought the issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing respondents to release all the retiral benefits accrued to the petitioners i.e. leave encashment, gratuity etc. with all consequential benefits along-with interest @ 18% per annum with further direction to respondents to consider the entire continuous service rendered by them as regular service and also grant them all consequential benefits as that of regular employees including pension.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that a joint representation

was moved by the petitioners to the Joint Development Commissioner, Mohali, Chandigarh on July 20, 2009 (P-8) but no response has been received from the authorities till date. He further submits that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondents to consider and decide the representation (P-8) within a stipulated period.

3. Accordingly, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioners in the representation (P-8) and to take a conscious decision in accordance with law as well as instructions issued by the Government from time to time, positively within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. However, if the petitioners still feel aggrieved by any order of the aforesaid authorities, they shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
