Through the instant civil writ petition, preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to grant all the retiral benefits of the petitioner i.e. salary by counting his services as Junior Assistant w.e.f. July 24, 2001 i.e. when the post became vacant and all other retiral benefits along with pay scale of 4-9-14 and further by treating him to have been promoted as Senior Assistant and Superintendent from the dates he was required to be promoted as such by counting his services as Junior Assistant w.e.f. July 24, 2001 with further directing the respondents to grant the arrears of salary, arrears of pension to the petitioner by counting his services as Junior Assistant w.e.f. July 24, 2001.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that though various representations including legal notice dated June 09, 2017 (P-6) were made to the respondents but till date neither any reply to the said legal

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notice/representations has been received nor any final order has been passed by the concerned Department.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.3 to decide the aforesaid legal notice (P-6) within some specified period.

4. Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents No.3-The Deputy Director, Animal Husbandry, Ludhiana O/o Animal Husbandry Farms, Matthewara, Ludhiana to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in his legal notice June 09, 2017 (P-6) and to take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order as per rules and instructions issued by the Government of Punjab from time to time within a period of four months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

5. However, if petitioner still feels aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, he shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
