Through the instant civil writ petition, preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of a writ especially in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to grant the revised pension and others pensionary benefits by counting work charge service w.e.f. 22.04.1982 to 30.11.1994, which becomes 12 years 07 months & 08 days approx. along with regular service w.e.f. 01.12.1994 to 30.09.2012, which becomes around 17 years 09 months & 29 days approx. and total service become 30 years 05 months & 09 days, but petitioner granted pension only for 38 half years, whereas he is entitled for pension for 30 ½ years (61 half years) as Rule 6.1 of PCS Rule Vo. 2 is application on the petitioner, which provides that fraction of year equal to three months and above shall be treated as a completed 6 monthly period along with interest @ 12% per annum.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that though a legal notice dated September 21, 2017 (P-3) was issued to the respondents but no final decision has been taken by the concerned authorities till date.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.2 to decide the aforesaid legal notice in a time bound manner.

4. Instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2-Executive Engineer, Distribution Division, Punjab State Power Corporation Limited, Dasuya, District Hoshiarpur to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in his legal notice dated September 21, 2017 (P-3) and take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order in the light of the order dated September 29, 2017 passed in CWP No.22404 of 2017 captioned as ***Joginder Singh vs. Punjab State Power Corporation Limited and ors.*** within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

5. However, in case, petitioner still feels aggrieved of the order passed by concerned authority, he shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
