Through the instant civil writ petition, preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to release all the retiral benefits accrued to her i.e. gratuity, commuted value of pension, leave encashment, arrears of dearness allowance, GP fund, arrears of contributory fund etc. along with interest @ 18% per annum from the date it became due till its actual realization..

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that petitioner stood retired on June 30, 2003 on attaining the age of superannuation but till date nothing has been paid to her. Petitioner constrained to serve legal notice dated July 07, 2017 (P-3) upon the respondents, which did not fetch any reply. He further submits that she feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondents to consider and decide her afore-said legal notice (P-3) within a time bound manner.

3. Instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in her legal notice (P-3) and to take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order considering all the facts narrated in the aforesaid legal notice within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

4. However, if petitioner still feels aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, she shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
