Reply by way of additional affidavit of Jang Bahadur Sharma, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Headquarter, Hoshiarpur on behalf of respondents has been filed by learned State counsel in court today, which is taken on record subject to all just exceptions.

2. By virtue of instant petition preferred under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of an appropriate writ especially in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to re-fix the pension of the petitioner after re-fixing his pay w.e.f. April 01, 1978 to November 30, 1994 as well as to release all retiral benefits with further direction to respondents to reimburse ₹16,905/- deducted from the pension of the petitioner.

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3. At the very outset of the arguments, learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that in view of passing of order dated July 20, 2017, (Annexure R-4), instant petition has rendered infructuous. However, a direction be issued to the respondents to release arrears within some specified period.

4. In view of statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, instant petition is dismissed as having rendered infructuous.

5. However, respondents are directed to release arrears within a period of 45 days from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
