In the instant writ petition, petitioner has challenged the award passed by the Labour Court dated 15.01.2015.

Having regard to the nature of appointment of the petitioner that it was a contract, rightly the Labour Court refused to entertain the reference in view of the provisions of Section 2(oo) (bb) of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 (for short “the Act”). That apart perusal of the terms and conditions of appointment, it is evident that while terminating the services of the petitioner, they have not violated any condition imposed in the agreement (Annexure R-3/1). Thus, the petitioner has not made out a case so as to interfere with the award passed by the Labour Court.

Accordingly, petition stands dismissed.
