The petitioners seek a writ of mandamus to direct the respondent-University to reduce the minimum qualifying marks in DET-17 and consequently grant them admission in Veterinary and Livestock Development Diploma in the private-Institutes where some seats are stated to be still lying vacant.

It is an admitted case that minimum qualifying marks for admission to the afore-said Diploma were 35% for General Category and 33% for Scheduled Caste Category, which the University has already reduced to 25% for General Category and 23% for Scheduled Caste Category. The petitioners are amongst those who have not secured even 25% or 23% marks, as the case may be. They thus seek a direction to the University to further reduce the minimum qualifying marks and make them eligible for admissions.

In our considered view, no such mandamus can be issued by a writ-Court as it is for the University or the subject specialists to decide as to what should be the minimum standard for admission to the aforesaid

Diploma Course. The writ petition is thus disposed of with liberty to the petitioners to pursue their representation before the University, which is stated to be still pending consideration.

With liberty aforementioned, the writ petition stands disposed of.
