This petition is filed against the final assessment order dated 01.02.2013 (Annexure P.5) passed under Section 126 of the Electricity Act, 2003 (for short, 'the Act') and the order dated 01.01.2014 by which appeal filed by the petitioner under Section 127 of the Act has been dismissed.

In short, the petitioner is owner of the Warehouse which has been let out to pharmaceutical company of Mumbai. The premises of the petitioner was checked by the Electricity Department and found it indulging in unauthorised use of electricity, therefore, the provisional notice was given to the petitioner in regard to assessment of the unauthorised use of electricity. The petitioner filed reply to it and ultimately final order of assessment was passed on 01.02.2013. Aggrieved against the said order, the petitioner filed appeal under Section 127 of the Act before the Appellate Authority but the same was dismissed by the impugned order dated 01.01.2014.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has vehemently argued that the order of final assessment and the order passed by the Appellate Authority are illegal but could not point out any error and from the perusal of both the impugned orders, I do not find any reason to interfere in the same and hence, the present petition is hereby dismissed.
