By virtue of the instant civil writ petition, preferred under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, petitioners have sought the issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to grant the pay scale of 3120-6200 under ACP Scheme as per the instructions of personnel Department dated 25.09.1998 (P-1) and also refix the pay & pension along with all consequential benefits and decide the case of the petitioners in the light of the judgments in ***CWP No.7005 of 2001 captioned as Joga Singh & ors. vs. State of Punjab & ors.*** decided on 03.04.2014, ***CWP No.16571 of 2003***, ***CWP No.7292 of 2004 titled as Bharpoor Singh & ors. Vs. State of Punjab & ors.*** decided on 01.12.2016 along with interest.

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2. The contention of learned counsel for the petitioners is that the matter with regard to grant of benefit under the ACP scheme as per the instructions of personnel Department dated 25.09.1998 (P-1) was forwarded by the Senior Superintendent of Police, Kapurthala vide letter No.74975 dated 26.10.2015 (P-6) to the Director General of Police, Punjab, Chandigarh (Litigation Branch). But no further action was taken by the aforesaid office. Subsequently, petitioners were also constrained to serve various representations dated 01.11.2017 (P-7 colly). But the said representations also did not fetch any reply.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioners feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.2 to take a conscious decision on the aforesaid letter (P-6) within some stipulated period.

4. Instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2 to take a conscious decision on the aforesaid letter dated 26.10.2015 (P-6) by passing a speaking order, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

5. However, if petitioners still feels aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority in pursuance of this order, they shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
