Copy of order No.14 dated November 03, 2017 passed by Chief Forest Conservator, Research Circle, Hoshiarpur is taken on record subject to all just exceptions and be annexed at appropriate place. Accordingly, application stands allowed.

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Though, vide instant civil writ petition, preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the quashing of order dated April 01, 2013 (P-15) passed by respondent No.2 and order

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dated April 27, 2012 (P-11) passed by respondent No.3 and further to release the pension and retiral benefits of the petitioner along with arrears of pension with interest @ 12% per annum. Yet petitioner feels satisfied with the orders dated August 23, 2017 (P-23/T) passed by the Chief Forest Conservator, Research Circle, Bassi Jana, Tanda Bye Pass, Hoshiarpur and dated September 07, 2017 (P-24/T) passed by Additional Secretary (Forest). However, it is added by learned counsel for the petitioner that though the pension case of the petitioner is stated to have been processed by the Chief Forest Conservator, Research Circle, Hoshiarpur way back in the month of September, 2017. Yet no effective decision has been taken. The concerned authorities may be directed to deal with and dispose of the same within some stipulated period.

2. Accordingly, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents No.2 & 3 to deal with and dispose of the pension case of the petitioner within three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. In case of favourable order to the petitioner, all the arrears be calculated and paid within a period of next one month positively.

3. In case of any failure or non-compliance on the part of the respondents, petitioner shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
