By virtue of the instant civil writ petition, preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioners have sought the issuance of a writ especially in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to grant deemed date of regularization to the petitioners as Helper Grade-I w.e.f. date their juniors have been granted benefit along with all consequential benefits, especially by extending benefit of judgments rendered in *LPA No.1141 of 2014, captioned as Haryana Power Generation Corporation Ltd. & anr. vs. Maha Singh* decided on 12.09.2014 (P-8) and *LPA No.1137 of 2014 titled as Haryana Power Generation Corporation Ltd. Panchkula & anr. vs. Randhir Singh & anr.* decided on 12.09.2014 (P-6), which stands implemented vide order dated 06.08.2015 (P-7) along with interest @ 18% per annum.

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2. Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that though a legal notice was made to the respondent No.1 on June 03, 2016 (P-10) but till date neither any reply to the said legal notice has been received nor any final order has been passed by the concerned department.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioners further submits that they feel satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondent No.1 to decide the aforesaid legal notice (P-10) in a time bound manner.

4. Instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No. 1 to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioners in the aforesaid legal notice dated June 03,. 2016 (P-10) and to take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order particularly in view of the judgments reflected in the aforesaid legal notice, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

5. However, if petitioners still feel aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, they shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
