Petitioner seeks a writ in the nature of mandamus under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for release of payment of ₹ 22,74,185/- qua the allotted work of Construction of Automated Driving Test Centre in Sector 32, Samrala Road, Ludhiana.

It is the case of the petitioner that work had been allotted to the petitioner vide allotment letter No. 4569 dated 16.3.2015 which has been duly completed by the petitioner within the time but certain payments remained outstanding on account of various works, which has been detailed in *paragraph 3*. It is accordingly the case of the petitioner that legal notice dated 7.11.2017 (Annexure P-1) has already been served upon respondents No. 5.

Counsel further submits that he would be satisfied if the legal notice dated 7.11.2017 (Annexure P-1) is decided by respondent No. 5 within the specified time.

Keeping in view the above, no useful purpose will be served by calling upon the respondents to file reply, since the decision making process is not complete.

Accordingly, without commenting upon the merits of the case or the entitlement of the petitioner, the present writ petition is disposed of with the direction to respondent No. 5 to decide the legal notice dated 7.11.2017 (Annexure P-1) within a period of 2 months from the receipt of the certified copy of this order.

In case, the amount is found due, the payment shall be released forthwith and in case, the amount is to be denied the same be conveyed to the petitioner by passing a speaking order.
