By virtue of instant petition preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to grant him pension in accordance with Panjab University Employees (Pension) Regulations, 1991 as amended from time to time after completion of all the formalities w.e.f. February 2017, onwards and to release all the arrears thereof, within the stipulated time along-with interest @12% per annum on the delay payment(s).

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that though legal notices dated July 27, 2017 and November 06, 2017 (P-14 and P-15 respectively) were served upon the respondent but till date neither any reply to the notice(s) has been received nor any conscious decision has been taken. He further submits that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondents to consider and decide the legal notices (P-14 and P-15) within some stipulated period.

3. Accordingly, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in the legal notices (P-14 and P-15) and to decide the same in accordance with law, rules, regulations and instructions issued by the government of Punjab as well as by the Panjab University from time to time within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

4. However, if the petitioner still feels aggrieved by any order of afore-said authority, he shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
