JASWANT SINGH, J. (Oral)

Ranjit Singh (petitioner No.1) and Gurmeet Singh (petitioner No.2) belong to the Ex-Serviceman S.C. (M&B) category. They have competed for appointment to the post of Constable for district police, pursuant to the advertisement dated 31.05.2016 (**Annexure P-1**).

The grievance of Ranjit Singh (petitioner No.1) is that in his Online Application Form, he has inadvertently typed the category of Ex-Serviceman SC (R&O) instead of Ex-Serviceman S.C. (M&B).

The grievance of Gurmeet Singh (petitioner No.2) is that he has secured 22 marks as per the selection criteria and persons junior to him in merit have been appointed.

Upon notice, learned State Counsel, on instructions from Sh. Jasvinder Singh, Junior Assistant, Recruitment Cell and Sh. Mahesh, Litigation Branch, O/o D.G.P., Punjab, submits that as far as petitioner No.1-Ranjit Singh is concerned, he has been considered and merit

determined in the Ex-Serviceman S.C. (M&B) category and, therefore, the grievance is misplaced.

As regards petitioner No.2-Gurmeet Singh, it is submitted that his marks secured indeed are 22, however, no person in his category having marks lower than him has been selected.

In view of the aforesaid stand of the State, learned Counsel for the petitioners prays for permission to withdraw the present petition.

Accordingly, the present petition stands dismissed as withdrawn.
