The petitioner is claimed to have applied for allotment of a plot being 'local displaced person' on 19.02.1975. The application was given to the Improvement Trust, Ludhiana as the petitioner's land measuring 281 square yards, mentioned in para No.3 of the writ petition, was acquired for a development scheme of the Trust. The petitioner thereafter claims to have represented several times. He also relies upon some instances where Chairman of the Trust, for the reasons best known to him, has entertained stale and obsolete claims after decades and allotments have been made.

Taking into consideration those instances of allotments (copies of the orders attached), it appears expedient to dispose of this writ petition without expressing any views on merits of the petitioner's claim, with a direction to the Chairman of the Trust to determine (i) whether the petitioner had applied on 19.02.1975 for allotment of a plot; (ii) whether the petitioner was/is eligible for allotment of a plot in lieu of acquisition of his small piece of land measuring 281 square yard; (iii) if so, whether the petitioner's claim should be entertain at this belated stage?

accepting the claim of the petitioner, the allotment shall be made on current market price. Let the needful be done within a period of six months from the date of receiving a certified copy of this order.
