The petitioner claims that he was a resident of Labour Colony, Sector 31-C, Chandigarh where he used to do the business of watch repair and electrical work in the name and style of 'Goel Watch Company'. Thereafter, he started a 'Radio Shop' in the name and style of 'Milan Radio'. The petitioner alleges that the above-stated Labour Colony was demolished with an idea to rehabilitate the residents of colony under the Chandigarh Licensing of Tenements and Transit Sites in Chandigarh, Scheme, 1975. It is further averred that a survey was conducted in which *jhuggi* of the petitioner was numbered as 290 and as per the survey report, he was entitled to allotment of one residential as well as one commercial plots, especially in the light of the Scheme notified on 26.10.1983. It is further alleged that file of the petitioner's application-form was misplaced by the officials of the respondent-Administration with a view to deprive him the allotment. After a long story of making representations here and there including complaints to Vigilance Bureau and CBI, the petitioner is further said to have requested the authorities for revival of his claim for allotment of residential/

him on 05.05.2016 (P-7) to the Advisor to Administrator, U.T., Chandigarh.

From the facts narrated by the petitioner, it appears that he has been occasionally approaching the authorities during the years 1983 to 2006, however, his claim for allotment of plot has not been adjudicated by any Authority so far.

In this view of the matter, we dispose of this writ petition without expressing any views on the petitioner's entitlement and without condoning the delay, with a direction to the Estate Officer, U.T. Chandigarh to call for the records and determine the petitioner's claim, referred to above, in accordance with law preferably within a period of four months from the date of receiving a certified copy of this order.

Ordered accordingly.
