The petitioner is working as Lecturer-in-Political Science (School Cadre). She has been transferred to Government Senior Secondary School, Mankrola, District Gurugram. She, on the other hand, wants to be posted near Gurugram and it is stated that one post would fall vacant in Government Girls Senior Secondary School, Jacobpura, District Gurugram on 30.04.2017. The petitioner's husband is stated to be visually handicapped. She has two daughters, one married and the other pursuing MBBS degree at Solan (Himachal Pradesh). Since there is none in the family to look-after the petitioner's husband who requires consistent assistance, the petitioner is stated to have represented the authorities for sympathetic consideration of her request to transfer her at Government Girls Senior Secondary School, Jacobpura, District Gurugram. Finding no response thereto, the instant writ petition has been filed.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner though we do not find any ground to interfere with the transfer policy, nevertheless, keeping in view the mitigating circumstances highlighted by the petitioner,

it appears expedient to dispose of this writ petition with a direction to respondent Nos.2 & 3 to consider the petitioner's above-mentioned request sympathetically and see the desirability of transferring her at the place where she can properly look-after her husband.

It shall be appreciated if some decision is taken within a period of one months from the date of receiving a certified copy of this order.
