Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner could not clear the paper of Law of Torts in 4th semester in May, 2014. He thereafter, re-appeared in May, 2015 and in May, 2016 in the said paper but still he could not clear the same and has prayed for another chance which has been rejected by the University vide order dated 11.04.2017(Annexure P-5) and the same has been challenged in the present writ petition.

Counsel for the petitioner has referred to Clause 6 of the Bachelor of Laws(5 years Integrated course) Ordinance contained in Calendar Vol.III, 2008(Ordinances for Examinations). However, the said Clause can not help the petitioner because in it, it is specifically provided that the student has to re-appear in the examinations within a period of three years of joining of the said semester. Meaning thereby, the petitioner had to clear the paper of Law of Torts till May, 2016 in which he has failed. Consequently, no further chance can be granted to the petitioner.
