By this petition the petitioner has challenged the show-cause notice without having filed a reply. On being confronted, the learned counsel prays for permission to withdraw this petition with liberty to now file a reply to show-cause notice. When I pointed out to him that show-cause notice issued to the petitioner on 10.04.2017 and provided 20 days' time for filing reply and that period is over and therefore the petitioner must have been relieved, he states that though the period for filing reply is over yet the petitioner is still in the job and no order has been passed and prays that in case he files the reply within 2 days from today the respondents be directed to consider the same before passing any order of termination of

I am not in a position to unequivocally accepted the statement of the learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner is still working. However, if this statement is correct and the petitioner is still working and files a reply on or before 11.05.2017, the respondent No.3 would consider the same despite the fact that it is now beyond the period of 20 days provided to him.

Petition stands disposed of in the above terms.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending Civil Misc. Application, if any, also stands disposed of.
