For the reasons mentioned in the application, marginal
delay of 41 days in filing the appeal is condoned.

LPA No.151 of 2016

The appellant is aggrieved of the order dated
15.11.2016 remanding the matter for appointment of a Lambardar
to the District Collector and further directing de-novo process.

We find that the appellant as also the selected
candidate are octogenarians and therefore we are in agreement
with the finding of the learned Single Judge who has opined the
process needs to be gone into afresh particularly when

the initial process, which resulted in the grievance of the appellant, took place at least 10 years back. This is not to say that the appellant would not be entitled to participate in the process but suffice it to say that there is no justifiable reason to interfere with the impugned order which has been passed in the peculiar set of circumstances.

Appeal dismissed.
