This is an application for condonation of delay of 1846 days in filing the accompanying appeal.

All what has been urged by learned counsel for the applicants is that the matter in issue is squarely covered by the judgment, dated 23.04.2016, rendered by this court in RFA No.2176 of 2012 [**Rajinder v. State of Haryana**], vide which in the appeals arising out of the same acquisition, this court had enhanced the compensation awarded to the landowners.

Mr. Shivendra Swaroop, AAG, Haryana, present in court, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent.

The factual position, as set out above, is not disputed by learned State counsel.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the record.

In the wake of the decisions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Imrat Lal and others v. Land Acquisition Collector and others, 2015(2)

RCR (Civil) 437 and Dhiraj Singh (D) Tr. LRs. v. Haryana State and others, 2015 (2) RCR (Civil) 507, delay of 1846 days in filing the accompanying appeal is condoned. However, for the period of delay the applicants shall not be entitled to interest on the enhanced compensation.

For, the learned counsel for the parties are ad idem that the matter in issue is squarely covered by the decision rendered by this court in Rajinder's case (supra), the present appeal is disposed of in the same terms. However, the appellants shall not be entitled to interest on the enhanced compensation for the period of delay in filing the appeal i.e. 1846 days.
