CM-6031-CI-2017:

For the reasons set out in the application, which is duly supported by an affidavit, the same is allowed. Consequently, the delay of 1894 days in re-filing the accompanying appeal is condoned.

CM-6032-CI-2017:

This is an application for condonation of delay of 71 days in filing the accompanying appeal.

All what has been urged by learned counsel for the applicant/appellant is that the matter in issue is squarely covered by the judgment, dated 28.03.2016, rendered by this Court in RFA No. 2322 of 2011, titled “Usha Rani and others v. State of haryana and others”, and other connected cases, vide which in the appeals arising out of the same acquisition, this Court had enhanced the compensation awarded to the landowners to Rs. 48,57,000/- per acre.

The factual position, as set out above, is not disputed by learned counsel for the respondents.

For, the learned counsel for the parties are *ad idem* that the matter in issue is squarely covered by the decision rendered by this Court in Usha Rani's case (supra), the present appeal is disposed of in terms of the said decision.
