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**RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (ORAL)**

Applicant-wife, by way of instant transfer application under Section 24 of the Code of Civil Procedure (for short 'CPC'), seeks transfer of the petition under Section 10 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 ('the Act' for short) titled as Sandeep Singh Vs. Usmeet Kaur filed by respondent-husband from Patiala to Karnal.

Notice of motion was issued and the learned trial Court was directed to adjourn the case beyond the date fixed before this Court.

Reply filed on behalf of the respondent-husband in the Court today, is taken on record and copy thereof has been supplied to learned counsel for the applicant.

Heard learned counsel for the parties.

Learned counsel for the respondent-husband, at the very outset,

submits that he has got no objection in case his petition under Section 10 of the Act is transferred from Patiala to any other place except Karnal, because the respondent-husband is having bonafide apprehension at the hands of the family members of the applicant-wife.

In view of the above and keeping in view the totality of facts and circumstances of the case, present transfer application is allowed and the petition under Section 10 of the Act titled as Sandeep Singh Vs. Usmeet Kaur filed by respondent-husband is ordered to be transferred from Patiala to Kurukshetra, instead of Karnal.

Consequently, learned District Judge, Patiala is directed to send complete record of the abovesaid petition to the learned District Judge, Kurukshetra, at an early date but in any case within a period of one month from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

The learned District Judge, Kurukshetra is also directed either to decide the case himself or assign it to the learned Court of competent jurisdiction, for an early decision, in accordance with law.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, present transfer application stands disposed of, however, with no order as to costs.
