1. The appeal is against the judgment and decree dated 15.01.2015 passed by learned Additional District Judge, Chandigarh, whereby petition filed by the appellant under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 (for short, 'the Act') has been dismissed.

2. Learned counsel for the applicant-appellant (husband) states that the matter has been amicably settled between the parties by filing a joint petition under Section 13-B of the Act before the trial Court. Photocopy of the order and decree dated 27.02.2017 has been produced in Court today, which is taken on record. Vide order dated 27.02.2017 after the second motion, the petition filed under Section 13-B of the Act was allowed and the marriage between the parties has been dissolved by a decree of divorce by mutual consent.

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3. In view thereof, learned counsel for the applicant-appellant submitted that the present application as well as main appeal have been rendered infructuous and may be disposed of as such.
