Despite taking time on March 10, 2015 an application has not been moved for which purpose the case was adjourned *sine die*.

The office has listed this matter for hearing after 2 years of non-compliance of the Court directions. No one appears on behalf of the petitioner.

Notice of motion was not issued in this case. It would serve the ends of justice in a wholesome way if this matter is disposed of with a direction to the son of the petitioner to move a formal request before the authorities for discharge from the Indian Navy on compassionate ground of illness of parents. In case such an application is moved this Court has no doubt that the same would be processed as per law. For the sake of record of the respondents, the interim order dated March 10, 2015 is reproduced below:-

“The petitioner in this case is praying for a mandamus to the respondents to discharge his

son from the Indian Navy on the compassionate ground of illness of parents. It is not disputed that his son, the official concerned, has also moved a formal request under the Rules for the same purpose. To my mind the non-consideration of the prayer would give a cause of action to his son but not to him because as per the rules it is only his son who can move the application. Learned counsel states that there are cases where the respondents had acted on the request of the parents/beneficiaries also and seeks an adjournment to place them on record.

Adjourned sine die.

To be listed as and when an application is moved in this regard.”

The petition stands disposed of as above.
