The applicants pray for transfer of petition MACP/128/2017 Manjit Kaur and others Vs. Raghubir Singh and others from the Motor Accidents Claims Tribunal, Patiala (in short 'the Tribunal') to a Tribunal at Sangrur.

Counsel for the applicants has submitted that after death of her husband, Manjit Kaur – petitioner No.1 along with three minor children is residing at Sangrur, therefore, it is difficult for her to go to Patiala for pursuing the claim application filed by her parents in law in which the applicants have also been impleaded as petitioners No.1 to 4.

The physical distance between the two places is approximately 60 KMs. The application for compensation has been filed by parents of deceased Sandeep Singh wherein the applicants have also been arrayed as petitioners No.1 to 4. Personal appearance of the applicants is not required on each and every date fixed in the case.

Petitioner No.1 may like to appear as a witness to substantiate her claim for

compensation. Under the circumstances, it would be appropriate that the petition is allowed to continue at the place where the same is filed. However, the Tribunal shall ensure that statement of petitioner No.1 as a witness is recorded on the day she appears before the Tribunal for the purpose.

With the aforesaid observations, the petition stands disposed of.
