ORDER

10.03.2017

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By the present petition the petitioners seek quashing of FIR No. 435/2015 under Sections 448/380/457/354/323/354B/34 IPC registered at PS Ashok Vihar, Delhi on the complaint of Respondent No.2 and the proceedings pursuant thereto on the ground that the parties have settled the matter.

Learned APP for the State on instructions from Investigating Officer submits that in the above-noted FIR the four petitioners as named in the amended memo of parties are the only accused and respondent No.2 the complainant/victim and respondent No.3 the other victim.

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Respondent No. 2 and 3 are present in Court and are identified by the learned counsel and the Investigating Officer. They state that they have settled the matter with the petitioners before the Delhi High Court Mediation and Conciliation Centre on 27th January, 2016 and thus they do not wish to pursue the above-noted FIR and the proceedings pursuant thereto. They further state that they will abide by the terms of settlement arrived at between the parties on 27th January, 2016 copy whereof is enclosed as Annexure P-8 to the present petition.

Petitioners who are present in Court and are identified by the learned counsel affirm the statement of respondent No.2 and 3 and state that they will abide by the terms of settlement arrived at between the parties.

In view of the fact that the parties have amicably resolved their differences of their own free will, volition and without any coercion and no useful purpose will be served in continuance of the proceedings, rather the same would create further acrimony between them, it would be in the interest of justice to quash the abovementioned FIR and the proceedings pursuant thereto. There is no legal impediment in quashing the FIR in question.

Consequently, FIR No. 435/2015 under Sections 448/380/457/354/323/354B/34 IPC registered at PS Ashok Vihar, Delhi and proceedings pursuant thereto are hereby quashed.

Parties have signed this order sheet in acknowledgment of their statements made before this Court.

Petition is disposed of. Order dasti.
