ORDER

This is a petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.614/2014, under Sections 451/323/34 IPC, registered at Police Station-Mundka, Delhi and all proceedings emanating therefrom.

Counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners and the respondent No.2 are the real brothers and due to some misunderstanding arisen between the parties, a quarrel had taken place resulting into registration of FIR No.614/2014, under Sections 451/323/34 IPC at Police Station-Mundka, Delhi. Counsel further submits that after the registration of the FIR, the near relatives and the friends intervened and the matter has been amicably settled between the parties vide compromise deed dated 03.07.2017 and nothing remains to be adjudicated further between them and to have better relationship in near future, the present FIR, which is coming as a hurdle in their way, may be quashed.

The respondent No.2, Mr. Anil Kumar is present in Court today and

has been identified by the Investigating Officer SI Manoj Chabar, Police Station-Mundka, Delhi. The respondent No.2 submits that the petitioner No.1 is his younger brother and he has settled the matter amicably with the petitioners vide compromise deed dated 03.07.2017. He further submits that the settlement/compromise has taken place voluntarily, without any force, pressure or coercion. He submits that nothing remains to be adjudicated further between them and he has no objection if the FIR in question is quashed.

Keeping in view the above facts and circumstances, since the matter has been amicably settled between the parties who are stated to be real brothers and nothing remains to be adjudicated further between them, to promote peace in the family and for maintaining good relationship between the parties, I deem it appropriate to quash the FIR and all its subsequent proceedings. Consequently, FIR No.614/2014, under Sections 451/323/34 IPC, registered at Police Station-Mundka, Delhi and all proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed. Parties to remain bound by the terms of settlement dated 03.07.2017.

The present petition is allowed and disposed of accordingly.
