The instant petition has been filed by the petitioners seeking quashing of FIR No.750/2005 under Sections 498-A/406/506 IPC registered at Police Station-Patel Nagar, New Delhi on the complaint of respondent No.2 and the proceedings pursuant thereto on the ground that a compromise/settlement has been arrived at between the parties in the matter.

Respondent No. 2 is present in Court today. She states that she has settled the matter with the petitioners with her own free will and choice without any threat, pressure and coercion as per the terms and conditions of the Mediation Order dated 27.10.2016. She further submits that she has already received a sum of Rs.1,00,000/- (One Lakh only) from the petitioners and today she has received the balance amount of Rs.50,000/- (Fifty Thousand only) through DD No.068409 dated 14.09.2017 drawn on HDFC Bank, Faridabad, Charmwood Village, Faridabad, from the petitioners. She further states that she has no claim whatsoever remaining

against the petitioners and does not wish to pursue the abovementioned FIR and the proceedings pursuant thereto. A photo copy of the demand draft is taken on record.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he is making the statement on behalf of the petitioner No.2 as the petitioner No.2 is not present today. The petitioner No.2 is exempted through counsel.

Statements of the parties have been recorded separately.

In view of the fact that the parties have amicably resolved their differences voluntarily and of their own free will and without any coercion, pressure, and no useful purpose will be served in continuance of the proceedings, rather the same would create further acrimony between them, it would be in the interest of justice to quash the abovementioned FIR and the proceedings pursuant thereto. There is no legal impediment in quashing the FIR in question. Consequently, FIR No. 750/2005 under Sections 498-A/406/506 IPC registered at Police Station-Patel Nagar, New Delhi and proceedings pursuant thereto are hereby quashed.

The petition stands disposed of.
